As promised, we have filed the Declaratory Judgments to the Court relating to Travel, and to the Polygraph.

This does not mean the Court has to hear them, or to make a decision, but it starts the process, and with any luck, we will get a determination of our rights in relation to these issues for those of us currently on Lifetime Supervision.

These are serious issues that we are presenting to the Court, as they involve numerous violations of our Constitutional Rights, and numerous violations of the Nevada Revised Statutes by the Officers of the Department of Public Safety, and the Division of Parole and Probation. This is all sanctioned by the Board of Parole Commissioners, as they do not wish to address these issues in any manner. Any request concerning conditions of Lifetime Supervision must be approved by your Parole Officer, according to the Board, which does not allow for judicial review, or the right to appeal.

We are working as hard as we can to get many more items in front of the Courts for their further review, as the Board of Parole Commissioners and the Division of Parole and Probation are performing illegal actions and restraining Constitutional Rights.

It will be very interesting to see how the Courts view their actions, and if they follow any legal authority or judicial procedure in any of their hearings relating to Lifetime Supervision.

Soon, there will be a Declaratory Judgment in relation to Due Process, and how the hearings are held. It is very apparent that the Board of Parole Commissioners and all of the Members of the Board do not provide Due Process in any form or manner during these hearings. They also do not allow for judicial review, or for the right to appeal. Hopefully the Court will agree with us on these issues, as this member is fully prepared to go as far as needed within the Court System to bring these flagrant and egregious actions by the Board of Parole Commissioners to the Courts attention and review.

Hopefully you will enjoy reading about these issues that we are presenting to the Court, and you will see what we are doing to help everyone who is on the "special sentence" of Lifetime Supervision.
